



Islamic Tour Jordan

8 Days / 7 Nights

Jordan is a blessed land situated among the three great Muslim places: Mecca. Medina and Jerusalem. The land was a witness of Islam birth, its transformation into great religion. A great number of Muslims were killed and buried in Jordan.

Day 1: Arrival to Amman International airport. Meeting and assistance. Settling in Amman hotel.

Day 2: Breakfast, Visit to King Abdullah Mosque. It is a perfect sample of modern Islamic architecture. It has white marble walls and minarets with huge blue dome. The mosque was built by King Abdullah's grandson - Hussein in honors of the first king of Jordan killed in 1951. The king is a martyr. The mosque was built in 1990, it can include 7 000 prayers. In addition, in front of the mosque 3 000 men can pray. There is a small Islamic Museum in the mosque. Then transfer to the eastern part of Amman and visit the Citadel situated on



the hill. You can enjoy the perfect views of the suburbs. Visit Al-Hussein Mosque in the Down town. It was built by king Abdullah in 1924 on the spot of an ancient mosque (640 AD). Then visit new King Hussein Mosque (west of Amman). A picturesque site and huge building win your heart. The mosque looks very effective in the evening. Here there is a historical museum which contains unique documents relating to the history of Islam. Return to Amman.



Day 3: Breakfast, Jerash tour, Jerash is a mixture of the eastern and western culture. Everywhere there are signs of the ancient Greco-Roman Mediterranean culture and ancient Arabic traditions. Then transfer to the north of Jordan where you can observe two ecological and historical sights presented by nature and genius of Arabic medieval military architecture -the forests of Ajloun-Dibbin and the Crusaders' castle in which the Crusaders were defeated 800 years ago. Return to Amman.

Day 4: Breakfast. Karak tour. An ancient Crusader castle, it is situated on a hilltop about 900 meters above sea level. Transfer to Abdullah Ben Ravah's grave (in Al-Mazar), not far from Karak. Here you can observe also Jafar Ben Abi Talib's grave, the Prophet's cousin. He looked like the Prophet and assisted him on His way to Habasha and returned when Khaibar was lebarated. In Al-Mazar there is Zeid Ben Haris's grave, one of the first Muslims. Being a child, he was sold to be a slave. The Prophet bought him and released, then adopted the boy. Zeid headed the army. He died at the age of 55 in Hejree. Transfer to Petra. O/N.



Day 5: Breakfast. Petra tour. It is the wonder of the world. Walking along the streets one can see a lot of graves carved in the rocks, temples' facades. There is an ancient theatre (sitting capacity is 3 000), huge monastery of Deir and Palace-grave. Transfer to the Dead Sea. O/N.



Day 6: Free day on the Dead Sea shore. Here you can cure many diseases, consult a doctor and simply have a rest.

Day 7: Breakfast. The Jordan River tour. Here you can observe Derar Ben Al-Azvar's (one of the Prophet's friends) and Amer Ben Abi Vakkas (the Prophet's relative) graves. Amer was one of the first Muslims. He knew Koran by heart. He was said to be taken to Eden. Return to Amman.O/N.

Day 8: Breakfast. Transfer to Amman International airport and assistance with departure formalities
